Decisions: Constructive vs. Deconstructive

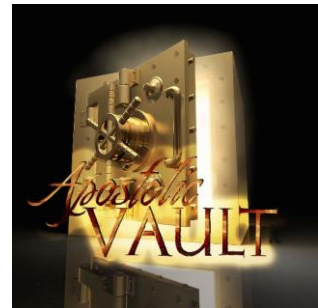

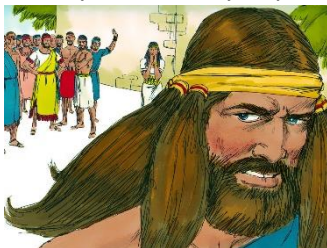
Apostolic Teaching:

Destructive vs. Constructive Decisions

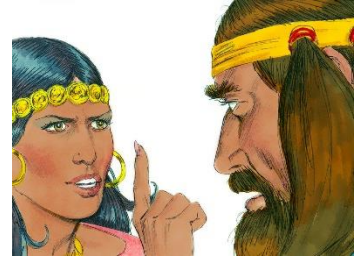
- We can make constructive or destructive decisions. We are not robotic.
- Stop being so quick to say that G-d gave us somethings, that we actually went and got ourselves.
- Decisions were made and lies were being told on G-d. G-d doesn't have anything to do with the decisions that some of us made that ended with bad consequences.
- When you get over His permissive will, you fall on the mercy of G-d and have to grab hold to the horns of the altar. Stop making destructive decisions because the decision you are making are making you who you are right now. The decisions will lead you to make other toxic decisions.
- Know your worth, your price is far above rubies. Your worth is expensive.



- Samson loved loose (whorish) women. He misused his authority and power. He went to Timnah and got a wife, that didn't have any love for G-d. Samson married this woman against the approval of his parents. His parents wanted him to marry someone from his own hometown of Israel. Once Samson married this woman he challenged her people with a riddle. He promised them that if they got the riddle

right he would reward them but if they got it wrong they were going to owe him a reward. Samson's wife people pressure her into finding out the answer to the riddle from Samson. So she annoyed and tricked Samson until he told her the answer. Once she had gotten the answer she told it unto her people. Which meant Samson owed her people a reward. In the end Samson's father-in-law gave his wife to Samson's best friend to sleep with. Samson got so mad that he destroyed the city. This shows that Samson was never in control of his emotions. He didn't learn from that situation and ended up getting with delightful Delilah.

- Delilah was very pretty and smooth and that was what Samson was attracted to. Because of what he saw it caused his flesh to rise and he made a destructive decision that cost him everything. The thing his flesh wanted set him up. She set him up several *times*. *And each time that he was freed from the situation he went back into it.* It got so bad that he told her the secret to his strength. He trust was in a woman and not in G-d. Lesson learned: Stop letting people know everything about you. Stop letting the devil cut you off from your source just to satisfy your flesh. Everything that looks good to you is not good for you.



- Solomon was supposed to be a wise man but when he got older he started getting with strange woman they turned him from Jehovah. This shows that you can be a wise man in one area but when it comes to the flesh you can be a fool. Wisdom has to saturate the soul.
- Somebody is being seduced and that spirit is being broken in here.
- Wise woman know your worth.
- Some choices that you are making are cancelling out the blessings that he is sending. "Ask G-d to turn a light from heaven on your soul and if you find anything wrong in you take out and strengthen you."



- Do you want to go to hell? It is your choice. Is it more important to live holy or satisfy your flesh?
- This is the day of decisions: multitudes in the valley of decisions. What decision you make today will change the rest of your life. This is a G-d and word decision. Are you going to stay with G-d or are you going to leave him? Are you going to live holy or are you going to let yourself get you out of G-d's will?
- G-d will not put with anybody that will pull you away from G-d. He didn't give you anything that will pull you away from G-d. Don't let them cut you off from the source of your joy or your life.
- Hold on to G-d. He is not a man that he should lie. He isn't going to give you something that is going to take you away from him. You better hold on, no matter how ugly it gets. Hold on to his unchanging hand. Don't let go of your anointing because you have been seduced by a seducing spirit.

- Don't be distracted by what is going on around you. Yield yourself to G-d. And make a choice that Hell is not for you.
- **Good News:** Just in case you laid your head in Delilah's lap, if you slipped up, and they cut your hair off ... it is starting to grow back, that means that G-d has not given up on you.
- Samson could not make his hair grow back. He couldn't add any additive to make his hair grow back. Grace is what it took. Automatically, all of a sudden, G-d remembered the Nazarite vow. G-d will allow you to get in some places that feel like bondage, but G-d is putting you there so that he can grow you back. The place that you are right now, aint that bad. G-d's riches at G-d's expenses.
- If Sampson had of stayed free and had not been captured by the Philistines, he would have totally destroyed himself foolishly. G-d could have blocked it or stopped it but he chose not to. When Samson was in the slavery position grinding at the mill he was unable to get a hold of wine and indulge. Over indulgence is not good. When you have freedom you will abuse and over indulge.
- G-d is repositioning the body of Christ, and if you are not where you think you ought to be , he is growing you right where you are. G-d is a master grower.

It's Growing Back!



- G-d had him in a place where he could be grown back. G-d had to grow the connection back that was broken. Everybody was laughing at Samson but he fulfilled the purposed and then G-d took him to heaven. But before he went, he was restored in the midst of destruction. And he was able to use his strength to destroy more Philistines during his death than he had ever living.
- G-d is shutting down somethings in our lives because he is growing us. You have to finish your course and your destiny.
